After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to approve the items on the Consent Agenda, subject to the final approval of the Administrator. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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B. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

1. Report on legislative activity by Locke Liddell & Sapp LLP

Senator Whitmire and Ms. Midence, representatives of Locke Liddell & Sapp LLP, the System's national legislative consultants, reported on current legislative activity at the national level.

No motion was made.

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2. Closed Session - Board serving as Medical Committee

Discussion of the following disability application and recalls was closed to the public under the terms of Section 551.078 of the Texas Government Code at 8:32 a.m.:

Mr. Tettamant, Administrator, reviewed with the Board the medical information and physicians' reports regarding the disability application of Warren G. Horton and the disability recalls of Alan J. Adamcik and Kelly D. Shoulders.

The meeting was reopened at 8:49 a.m.

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion to table the disability application of **Warren G. Horton** until the November regular Board meeting to allow time for more information to be gathered. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to grant continuance of **Alan J. Adamcik's** on-duty, Combined Pension Plan - Group B disability benefit, subject to the System's right under the Board-approved disability recall procedure to require Mr. Adamcik to undergo future medical examination(s) to determine if the disability still exists or if recovery has been made to the point that Mr. Adamcik is able to return to duty or two years, whichever is sooner. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to grant continuance of **Kelly D. Shoulders'** on-duty, Combined Pension Plan - Group B disability benefit, subject to the System's right under the Board-approved disability recall procedure to require Ms. Shoulders to undergo future medical examinations(s) to determine if the disability still exists or if recovery has been made to the point that Ms. Shoulders is able to return to duty, or two years, whichever is sooner. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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3. Pension status of Robert Jackson and Willie Taylor

Mr. Tettamant stated that several persons who were chiefs in the Police Department were demoted in 1999. They filed suit against the City, and all but two have accepted settlements and retired. Robert Jackson and Willie Taylor refused the City's offers and are pursuing their claims through litigation. Both are retired from the System.

On June 21, 2001 the City sent Chiefs Jackson and Taylor letters advising that they had been reinstated retroactively to October 1999. Speaking through their attorney, they protested vigorously. On August 7, they were told that if they did

not come to work by August 15, 2001, they each would be "deemed to have rejected your reinstatement, as well as all salary and benefits from August 15 forward, and to have affirmed your decision to remain on your retirement status with the City of Dallas."

For a variety of reasons, the plaintiffs did not instruct the City on distribution of the funds. Accordingly, the City sent each of them salary checks, and sent the System checks for (a) employee contributions on the wages; (b) employer contributions on the wages; and (c) a refund of all pension payments made through August 15.

Mr. Tettamant distributed the following memo to the Trustees, which explained the staff-proposed treatment of the funds until the rights of the parties are known. The proposal was intended to protect the rights of the System without injuring either of the parties. Copies were sent to the City Attorney and to the attorney for Chiefs Jackson and Taylor. Neither objected.

MEMORANDUM

Date: October 11, 2001

To: Board of Trustees

Subject: Robert Jackson and Willie Taylor

The System has received funds from the City of Dallas as a result of what the City described as a reinstatement of the above referenced individuals. Staff has verified the City's calculations as being correct. The staff recommendation is that, until the rights of the parties are finally determined, the funds be held under an escrow type arrangement in the account in which our trust fund holds cash. This is a highly conservative account that earns interest, which in the current economic environment is very modest.

If the Board adopts this proposal, Chiefs Jackson and Taylor would continue, without change, to receive pensions based upon their initial retirements. If they are later determined to have been reinstated and again left active service, they will be given a reasonable time to complete new retirement applications that would be effective as of the date of leaving active service.

If, after final resolution of all disputed issues, the System is entitled to the funds and there are to be increases in either or both Chief Jackson and Taylor's pension, the System will make no further claim on either the City or the Chiefs for the additional costs that would result from the change. If the outcome provides a different date of leaving active service, some further modifications in the amount due or paid to the System will be necessary. If the money is ultimately to be forwarded to one of the parties, any interest we have earned upon it would be paid, as well.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to approve the deposit of the checks received from the City of Dallas for Messrs Jackson and Taylor in the Pension System bank accounts until this issue is resolved. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was approved by the Board. Mr. Umlor was opposed to the motion.

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The meeting was recessed at 9:41 a.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 9:49 a.m.

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4. Pension System employee benefits package

Mr. Tettamant explained that the new plan year for System employees' benefits begins on November 1, 2001. Staff members have been working with BrooksBittner, the System's benefits administration provider, regarding proposed insurance carriers, benefit coverages, and renewal rates. Mr. Bittner discussed the various benefit plan options with the Board.

After discussion, Mr. McCollum made a motion to adopt the United Healthcare LH-W medical insurance plan, which is the current plan, for the new plan year. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

After further discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to change the income protection plan, which includes life insurance, accidental death and dismemberment, short-term disability insurance, and long-term disability insurance, from The Guardian to Fortis for the new plan year. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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5. Adjustments for retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Sections 6.01(e) and 6.04 – Group A; and Sections 6.02 and 6.05 – Group B, to be effective October 1, 2001

Mr. Tettamant stated that the Combined Pension Plan, Section 6.12, provides for adjustments to certain benefits being paid as of October 1 of each year, as follows:

5. Adjustments for retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Sections 6.01(e) and 6.04 – Group A; and Sections 6.02 and 6.05 – Group B, to be effective October 1, 2001 (continued)

Section 6.01(b) and 6.04(b) - Group A (formerly Old Plan)

Active police officers and firefighters received no pay increase effective October 1, 2001. Therefore; neither will Section 6.01(b), nor 6.04(b) - Group A (formerly Old Plan) pensioners or survivors receive an increase.

Sections 6.01(e), 6.04(c) & (d) - Group A (formerly Plan A)

and

Section 6.02 and 6.04(f) & 6.05(b) - Group B (formerly Plan B)

The above-referenced benefit groups provide for annual adjustments in an amount equal to four percent (4.00%) of the original base amount; however, should the Combined Plan Section 6.01(b) benefit be greater than the benefit under Group B, the higher amount will be paid, provided the member or survivor were eligible to receive a Group A, Section 6.01(b) benefit.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to approve the annual adjustments for retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Sections 6.01(e) and 6.04 – Group A; and Sections 6.02 and 6.05 – Group B, to be effective October 1, 2001. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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6. Service Incentive Pay for eligible retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Section 6.01(b) – Group A

Mr. Tettamant explained that according to the Combined Pension Plan, Section 6.01(c), those who retired after December 15, 1983 are eligible to receive Service Incentive Pay as long as the City of Dallas continues to pay it to active police officers and firefighters.

According to previously adopted Board Policy, the Service Incentive Pay (SIP) amount is paid in October of each year.

The amount varies by individual. It is calculated by using the retiree's last rank as an active employee, number of years worked and the state longevity pay.

The amount is prorated for those who were not on retirement for the entire year.

6. Service Incentive Pay for eligible retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Section 6.01(b) – Group A (continued)

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to approve the Service Incentive Pay for eligible retirees and survivors of the Combined Pension Plan, Section 6.01(b) – Group A. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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7. Police officer and firefighter pay lawsuits

Mr. Lawson reported on the status of the various pay lawsuits.

No motion was made.

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8. Custodial agreement

Mr. Tettamant stated that per the Board's authorization on June 14, 2001, the staff has issued a Request for Information (RFI) from the following firms for custodial and banking services:

Bank of New York Chase-JP Morgan Citibank NA Deutsche Bank-Bankers Trust Mellon Trust Northern Trust Company State Street Bank & Trust Company

The State Street contract expires as of December 31, 2001.

After discussion, Mr. Tomasovic made a motion to authorize the staff to select the custodial bank. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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9. Organizational update regarding L&B Realty Advisors

Mr. Tettamant discussed a memo that L&B Realty Advisors received from Old Mutual (US) Holdings Inc., stating that Old Mutual desires to keep L&B within the Old Mutual group.

9. Organizational update regarding L&B Realty Advisors (continued)

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the organizational status report on L&B Realty Advisors, with another review scheduled for January 2002. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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10. Pension System's monthly financial statement

The Board and staff discussed the monthly financial statement for the period ending August 31, 2001.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the monthly financial statement. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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11. Staff and Board Members' reports on Board-approved seminars and/or conferences they attended

a. Conference: Due Diligence: The Mitchell Group

Dates: September 11, 2001

Messrs. Brown, McCollum, Tomasovic, Umlor, Tettamant, and Blake reported on the due diligence.

b. Conference: North Texas Opportunity Fund Annual Meeting

Dates: September 19, 2001

Mr. Tettamant and Mr. Blake reported on the annual meeting.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the Board and staff members' reports on the Board-approved seminars and/or conferences they attended. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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12. Lease space for Fire Department Chaplains' offices

Mr. Tettamant stated that the offices of the Fire Department chaplains currently are housed at the Fire Department training facility. The chaplains have been directed to find new office space because the training program is expanding with four new training classes.

12. Lease space for Fire Department Chaplains' offices (continued)

Chaplain Denny Burris has inquired about the availability of office space at the Pension System office at 2301 N. Akard. He anticipates a requirement of approximately 300 square feet of space.

Sufficient temporary space is available on the third floor of the 2301 N. Akard Building. After build-out of the new Board Room on the first floor, permanent space will be available for the chaplains' offices on the first floor.

Staff referred Chaplain Burris to the leasing agent for the building.

On October 1, the Administrator discussed this issue with both Mr. Burris and Chief Larry Anderson. Chief Anderson will follow-up after a review of the Department's budget.

After discussion, Mr. McCollum made a motion to receive and file the report on lease space for the Fire Department Chaplains' offices, and table this item pending further action by the Fire Department. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.
