

Mr. Kevin Lynch and Mr. Richard Brown, representing the System's real estate investment consultant, The Townsend Group, reviewed with the Board the quarterly real estate investment performance for the third quarter ending September 30, 2001. The highlights of the real estate portfolio activity are as follows:

The Dallas Police & Fire Pension System ("Dallas P&F") Real Estate portfolio ended the third quarter September 30, 2001 with a market value of \$302,049,522. Based on the most current plan assets provided at November 30, 2001, real estate represented 15.9% of plan assets. In addition, there are unfunded commitments to seven investments totaling \$73.984 million (representing 3.9% of plan assets).
