After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to approve the items on the Consent Agenda, subject to the final review and approval of the Administrator. Mr. Umlor seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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# B. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

# **1.** Reports and recommendations of The Townsend Group, real estate investment consultants; possible action

- **a.** Quarterly real estate investment performance report for the fourth quarter ended December 31, 2003
- **b.** New loan program
- **c.** Specialized apartment investing program
- **a.** Messrs. Lynch and Brown, of The Townsend Group, reviewed the System's real estate performance for the fourth quarter ended December 31, 2003. The real estate investment performance was as follows:

After discussion, Mr. Tomasovic made a motion to receive and file the Townsend Group's fourth quarter 2003 performance report. Messrs. Edge and McCollum jointly seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

# **1.** Reports and recommendations of The Townsend Group, real estate investment consultants; possible action (continued)

**b.** The real estate investment consultants presented a new loan program for possible approval to enhance the return on the System's real estate investment portfolio. The Townsend Group recommended the initiation of an "Added Alpha" real estate program through the use of borrowing lower cost debt. This is achieved by collateralizing a portion of the Pension System's fixed income securities.

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to (1) approve The Townsend Group's recommendation regarding the new loan program, (2) give authority to the staff to renegotiate the repurchase agreement and the cross-collateralization agreement, and (3) amend all real estate separate account agreements accordingly, subject to the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

**c.** Messrs. Lynch and Brown also discussed a specialized apartment investment program with the Board and staff.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to have the staff schedule GMAC Institutional Advisors, LLC to give a presentation at the May 13, 2004 Board meeting regarding a potential multi-family real estate investment opportunity. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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#### 2. L & B Realty Advisors, Inc.

- **a.** Portfolio review
- **b.** Investment due diligence

Ms. Mullis, and Messrs. Smith, Plumlee, and Blake, of L&B Realty Advisors, reviewed the System's real estate investments managed by L&B.

In accordance with the terms of Section 551.072, Texas Government Code, the Board went into a closed executive real estate session at 10:55 a.m.

L&B Realty Advisors representatives discussed a pending real estate investment in Dallas, Texas.

The meeting was reopened at 11:05 a.m. and recessed.

### 2. L & B Realty Advisors, Inc. (continued)

The meeting was reconvened and the Board went into another closed executive real estate session at 11:17 a.m.

The meeting was reopened at 11:24 a.m.

The meeting was recessed at 11:25 for a due diligence and property inspection led by L&B Realty Advisors on a pending real estate investment in Dallas, Texas.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:30 p.m.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the reports by L&B Realty Advisors. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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## 3. Member Consent for Hearthstone MSII Homebuilding Investors, LLC

Mr. Tettamant explained that Hearthstone MS II, a real estate investment of the System, is requesting a change to the line of credit that is necessary for cash flow management of Hearthstone MS II. The approval will replace an existing Revolving Line of Credit with a Subscription Line of Credit and reduce potential interest costs to the fund. The Townsend Group, the System's real estate investment consultant, has recommended that the Member Consent be approved.

After discussion, Mr. Umlor made a motion to approve the Member Consent, subject to the final approval of the Administrator and Legal Counsel. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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#### 4. Kennedy Associates Real Estate Counsel, Inc.

- **a.** Due diligence meeting of March 24, 2004

In accordance with the terms of Section 551.072, Texas Government Code, the Board went into a closed executive real estate session at 1:35 p.m.

### 4. Kennedy Associates Real Estate Counsel, Inc. (continued)

#### a. & b.

Messrs. Roberts and Heap, of Kennedy Associates Real Estate Counsel, and Mr. Myers, of Myers & Crow, discussed with Board and staff members the due diligence meeting held on March 24, 2004, involving a potential real estate investment.

The meeting was reopened at 1:50 p.m.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to proceed with the potential real estate investment through Kennedy Associates Real Estate Counsel, Inc., subject to successful due diligence and the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was passed by the following vote:

For: Wachsman, McCollum, Brown, Shaw, Tomasovic, Umlor, and Mays

Against: Edge

**c.** Kennedy Associates requested that certain Pension System corporations used to hold real estate investments be dissolved because the assets were sold. The System's title-holding corporations were PFP Illinois Industrial, Inc., and PFP Midway Office, Inc.

After discussion, Mr. Tomasovic made a motion to dissolve PFP Illinois Industrial, Inc., and PFP Midway Office, Inc., as requested by Kennedy Associates. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

**d.** Kennedy Associates also requested approval for the election of a Board of Directors for certain DPF corporations used to hold System real estate assets. The Pension System's title-holding corporations were PFP Norwood Park, Inc.; PFP Illinois Industrial, Inc.; and PFP Midway Office, Inc.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to approve the election of boards of directors for the above-named corporations. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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## 5. CDK Realty Advisors

Reappointment of General Partner for Camel Square

Mr. Tettamant discussed with the Board the request for reappointment of a General Partner for Camel Square.

### 5. CDK Realty Advisors (continued)

Mr. Tettamant explained that Camel Square is an investment owned by the System and held in the real estate investment portfolio. The previous General Partner, Prizm Realty Acquisitions, LLC ("Prizm Realty"), a Texas limited liability company, was dissolved under the laws of the State of Texas. Prizm Realty needs the consent of the limited partners to assign its entire partnership interest in Camel Square to CDK Camel Square, LLC, a Texas limited liability company and a wholly owned subsidiary of CDK Realty Advisors, LP.

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to approve the appointment of CDK Camel Square, LLC as the general partner for Camel Square, subject to approval of documentation by the Administrator and attorney. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

Messrs. Cooley, Donahue, and Kroener, of CDK Realty Advisors, conducted a tour of the renovations at 2325 Akard Street, one of the System's investments adjacent to the Pension System's offices.

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#### 6. Closed Session - Board serving as Medical Committee

Discussion of the following disability recalls was closed to the public under the terms of Section 551.078 of the Texas Government Code at 2:01 p.m.:

Mr. Tettamant reviewed with the Board members the medical information and physicians' reports regarding the disability recalls of Mr. Bishop and Ms. Farmer. Sergeant Andrew Davis, of the Dallas Police Department, Personnel Division, discussed the disability recall of Ms. Farmer with the Board.

The meeting was reopened at 2:08 p.m.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to grant continuance of David G. Bishop's on-duty, Combined Pension Plan, Group B disability benefit, subject to the System's right under the Board-approved disability recall procedure to require Mr. Bishop to undergo future medical examination(s) to determine if the disability still exists or if recovery has been made to the point that Mr. Bishop is able to return to duty or two years, whichever is sooner. Mr. Shaw seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

#### 6. Closed Session - Board serving as Medical Committee (continued)

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to grant continuance of Sharon L. Farmer's off-duty, Combined Pension Plan, Group B disability benefit, subject to the System's right under the Board-approved disability recall procedure to require Ms. Farmer to undergo future medical examination(s) to determine if the disability still exists or if recovery has been made to the point that Ms. Farmer is able to return to duty or two years, whichever is sooner. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

After discussion, Mr. Tomasovic made a motion to receive and file the reports on pension-related legislative matters. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.
