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B. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

- 1. Reports and recommendations of The Townsend Group, real estate investment consultants; possible action
 - **a.** Real estate market overview
 - **b.** Quarterly real estate investment performance report for the first quarter ended March 31, 2005

Kevin Lynch and Richard Brown, both Principals from The Townsend Group, the System's real estate investment consultant, reviewed the System's real estate performance for the first quarter ended March 31, 2005. The real estate investment performance was as follows:

3.35%	22.32%	13.82%	12.90%	12.92%

Mr. Lynch also presented an overview of the current real estate market.

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion to receive and file the reports by The Townsend Group on the real estate investment performance for the first quarter of 2005. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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The meeting was recessed at 10:01 a.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 10:18 a.m.

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2. Real estate market overview by INVESCO Realty Advisors

Messrs. Dennis, Roberts, and (Blaine) Smith, from INVESCO Realty Advisors, discussed the current real estate market environment with the Board. Mr. Tettamant provided the following background:

INVESCO is one of the System's investment real estate advisors that manages approximately \$21,700,000 in real estate assets for the fund. INVESCO has been a fiduciary for the System since January 1995 and has produced the following net return numbers for the real estate portfolio:

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3. Possible investments in Idaho through CDK Realty Advisors

In accordance with the terms of Texas Government Code, Section 551.072, the Board went into a closed executive session – real estate at 11:01 a.m.

The Board discussed possible purchases of real estate investments in Idaho for the System's real estate investment portfolio with Messrs. Cooley, Donahue, and Kroener, from CDK Realty Advisors, and Mr. Schirmer, from Schirmer Ball Company and SMDI.

The meeting reopened at 11:45 a.m.

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The meeting was recessed at 11:45 a.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 12:29 p.m.

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The Board returned to closed executive session – real estate at 12:31 p.m.

The meeting was reopened at 2:06 p.m.

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to approve the new investment in Idaho through CDK Realty Advisors, subject to successful due diligence, contract negotiations and the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel, to authorize the Chairman to execute the contract, and to authorize the Administrator to perform all necessary acts and exercise all appropriate discretion to consummate the investment and ongoing operation. Mr. Wachsman seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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4. Legal issues including, but not limited to:

- c. Former Chiefs Jackson and Taylor claims

In accordance with the terms of Texas Government Code, Section 551.071, the Board went into a closed executive session - legal at 2:50 p.m.

Mr. Lawson, the System's outside legal counsel, gave an update on the abovementioned cases.

The meeting was reopened at 3:08 p.m.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the report by Mr. Lawson on legal issues. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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5. Pension-related issues for possible legislative consideration

- a. Reports from legislative consultants
- **b.** Other legislation

Mr. Davenport, General Counsel, reported on the final bill status of pending legislation. Mr. Tettamant discussed the Texas Pension Review Board's Early Warning System.

After discussion, Mr. Wachsman made a motion to receive and file the report on pension-related legislative issues. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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6. Possible plan amendments

Mr. Tettamant said that the Board considered proposed plan amendments at the Board meeting on June 9, 2005. He gave an update on the status of the possible changes approved by the Board for further consideration.

Staff is continuing to research the proposed changes and to develop plan document language. The actuary advised that, if the Board adopts a specific criteria to trigger payment of the annual adjustment, the actuary would have to account in future actuarial valuations for the likelihood of such payment. The actuary also provided a cost estimate for item #14 as follows:

20-year requirement for benefit supplement provision Cost – \$11,000,000
Years to Fund – additional one year to fund

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to present possible plan amendment #12 to the membership for consideration, effective January 1, 2007. The amendment would discontinue the automatic annual adjustment to pension benefits, affecting only those who are hired January 1, 2007 or later. The Board would retain the ability to grant ad hoc adjustments to pension benefits to the affected group, and no other plan amendments that have an actuarial impact could be approved until the automatic annual adjustment is restored. Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion. The motion passed by the following vote:

For: Shaw, Tomasovic, Brown, Edge, Umlor, and Wachsman

Against: Mays

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion not to consider possible plan amendment #13, which would permit Pensioners to vote on all proposed plan amendments. Mr. Umlor seconded the motion. The motion failed by the following vote:

For: Edge, Umlor, and Brown

Against: Mays, Shaw, Tomasovic, and Wachsman

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to retain for further consideration all the remaining proposed plan amendments. Messrs. Tomasovic and Edge jointly seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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7. Possible investments through L & B Realty Advisors, Inc.

In accordance with the terms of Texas Government Code, Section 551.072, the Board went into a closed executive session – real estate at 2:12 p.m.

Mr. (Andy) Smith and Ms. Mullis, of L & B Realty Advisors, Inc., gave an update to the Board regarding the possible purchase of a real estate investment in Dallas, Texas.

The meeting was reopened at 2:40 p.m.

Mr. Tomasovic seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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9. Sixth Amendment to the First Amended and Restated Limited Partnership Agreement of Lone Star Fund V (U.S.), L.P.

Mr. Tettamant stated that the General Partner is requesting that the Sixth Amendment to the First Amended and Restated Limited Partnership Agreement of Lone Star Fund V (U.S.) L.P. be approved by the Limited Partners. The amendment reinstates language found in previous Lone Star partnership agreements related to the limitation of liability to a Limited Partner appointing a member to the Advisory Committee in Section 2.03 (d). The General Partner believes this language is beneficial to the Limited Partners.

9. Sixth Amendment to the First Amended and Restated Limited Partnership Agreement of Lone Star Fund V (U.S.), L.P. (continued)

The System has invested with Lone Star in the following funds; Brazos, Lone Star Opportunity Fund, Lone Star Fund (LSF) II, LSF III, LSF IV, and LSF V. The Board approved a \$25,000,000 investment in Lone Star Fund V on August 12, 2004 and was subsequently allocated \$22,500,000 by the advisor.

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion to approve the Sixth Amendment to the First Amended and Restated Limited Partnership Agreement of Lone Star Fund V (U.S.), L.P. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.
