

MINUTE SUMMARY Board Meeting Thursday, July 12, 2007

B. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Mr. Tettamant called for a report on the Board-authorized on-site due diligence in Corrigan, Texas on June 22, 2007 to review various timber properties as presented by RMK Timberland Group. Jim McBride and Bob Sinclair from RMK participated in the due diligence review. The following attended the due diligence review and reported their findings: Steve Shaw, Gary Edge, Rector McCollum, and Steve Umlor, representing the Board of Trustees, and Brian Blake, Assistant Administrator-Investments, representing the investment team.

The Board also performed an on-site due diligence review in Brazil to review various properties as presented by RMK Timberland Group. Jim McBride from RMK attended this due diligence review. The participants were George Tomasovic, Rector McCollum, and Richard Wachsman, representing the Board of Trustees, and Richard Tettamant, Administrator, representing the investment team. A report on the due diligence review was given by the attendees.

After discussion, Mr. Shaw made a motion to approve the new real estate investment in Texas through RMK Timberland Group, subject to successful due diligence, contract negotiations, and the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel, to authorize the Chairman to execute the contract, and to authorize the Administrator to perform all necessary acts and exercise all appropriate discretion to consummate the investment and ongoing operation. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

2. RMK Timberland Group due diligence review (continued)

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion to proceed with the \$15 million real estate investment in Brazil through RMK Timberland Group, which had previously been approved, subject to successful due diligence, contract negotiations, and the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel, to authorize the Chairman to execute the contract, and to authorize the Administrator to perform all necessary acts and exercise all appropriate discretion to consummate the investment and ongoing operation. Mr. Umlor seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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7. Levine Leichtman Capital Partners Deep Value Fund, L.P.

Staff explained that the General Partner of the Levine Leichtman Capital Partners Deep Value Fund, L.P, one of the System's private equity investments, has requested that the Second Amendment to the Fourth Amended and Restated Agreement of Limited Partnership of Levine Leichtman Capital Partners Deep Value Fund, L.P. be approved by its

Limited Partners. The main request in the Amendment is to allow the New Mexico State Investment Council or its Affiliates to increase their Capital Commitments by \$8 million and the Aggregated Capital Commitments of the Fund shall not be greater than \$508 million.

The System has a \$75 million capital commitment to the Levine Leichtman Capital Partners Deep Value Fund, L.P.

After discussion, Mr. Edge made a motion to approve the Amendment, subject to the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel. Mr. McCollum seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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8. Pharos Capital Group

- a. Possible co-investments through Pharos Capital Group, LLC

Dr. Kneeland Youngblood, Managing Partner, Bob Crants, and Joe Acevedo, from Pharos Capital Group, LLC, one of the System's private equity investment managers, discussed two private equity co-investment opportunities with the Board. The two co-investment opportunities are in Nursefinders Inc. and Time Domain, Inc.

Staff reported that the System has already invested \$4,650,000 out of the original \$10,000,000 capital commitment to Pharos Capital Partners II-A, LP private equity investment fund.

After discussion, Mr. Umlor made a motion to approve an investment of \$10 million in Nursefinders Inc. and \$10 million in Time Domain, Inc., subject to successful due diligence, contract negotiations, and the final approval of the Administrator and legal counsel, to authorize the Chairman to execute the contract, and to authorize the Administrator to perform all necessary acts and exercise all appropriate discretion to consummate the investment and ongoing operation. Mr. Edge seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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The meeting was recessed at 2:12 p.m.
