1. Review of Administrator

The Board went into a closed executive session – personnel at 8:31 a.m.

The meeting was recessed at 10:22 a.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 10:29 a.m.

The meeting was reopened at 11:25 a.m.

1. Review of Administrator (continued)

Mr. Wojcik made a motion to request the resignation of Richard Tettamant, Administrator. Mr. Atkins seconded the motion, which passed by the following vote:

Mr. Tomasovic made a motion to appoint Don Rohan as Interim Administrator. Mr. Schutz seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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2. Reports and recommendations of NEPC

Rhett Humphreys CFA, Partner, and Jeff Roberts, Senior Research Consultant, Private Markets, of NEPC, the System's general investment consultant, were present to discuss various reports and recommendations. Mr. Humphreys provided a quarterly portfolio review for the quarter ending March 31, 2014.

After discussion, Mr. Wojcik made a motion to receive and file the NEPC quarterly portfolio review. Mr. Salinas seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

The meeting was recessed at 12:48 p.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:23 p.m.

Mr. Roberts gave the Private Markets review, which covered the performance of private investments through the fourth quarter of 2013.

After discussion, Mr. Salinas made a motion to receive and file the Private Markets review. Mr. Mays seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

3. BankCap Partners Fund I, L.P. distribution

BankCap Partners Fund I, L.P. has been one of the System's private equity managers since 2007, focusing on growth oriented investments in the U.S. banking industry. BankCap Partners will be distributing its interest in one of the portfolio companies, TriState Capital Holdings, Inc. (TSC), to the Limited Partners and has given two distribution options; either to receive cash proceeds or a distribution in kind (shares of the public stock). This election is due by June 13, 2014.

After discussion, Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the NEPC and staff recommendation to receive the BankCap Partners Fund I, L.P. distribution in cash. Mr. Atkins seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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4. Transtrend

Mr. Rohan stated that Transtrend Diversified Fund, LLC, one of the System's Global Asset Allocation investments managed by Robeco Investment Management, provided a portfolio review to the Investment Advisory Committee (IAC) on January 7, 2014. The Board also discussed and reviewed the Transtrend investment at the January 9, 2014, Board meeting. After deliberation, the Board requested staff to research the managed futures strategy and provide an informational report.

Staff presented an introduction and overview of the Global Asset Allocation asset class and managed futures strategies at the April 17, 2014, IAC. Discussion included managed futures basics, relative performance, and comparison to other commodity strategies.

After discussion, Mr. Friar made a motion to approve the NEPC and staff recommendation to authorize the Interim Administrator to liquidate the Transtrend investment and reallocate funds to AQR and PanAgora equally, execute documentation, perform all necessary acts, and exercise all appropriate discretion to facilitate this recommendation. Mr. Salinas seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

5. Investment and financial reports

The Board and staff reviewed the investment and financial reports.

After discussion, Mr. Salinas made a motion to receive and file the Group Trust monthly asset allocation report, the Group Trust monthly unitization report, the Group Trust performance report unaudited draft, and the Group Trust unaudited statement of net assets available for benefits. Mr. Atkins seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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6. 2013 audit report

Ms. Loveland discussed the progress of the 2013 financial statement audit.

After discussion, Mr. Atkins made a motion to receive and file the 2013 audit status update. Mr. Salinas seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

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7. Communications program

Mr. Rohan stated that Mr. Kleinman has requested that the Board review the System's communication program and that Staff is preparing a Request for Information (RFI) for communications services and is prepared to go forward.

After discussion, Mr. Salinas made a motion to receive and file Mr. Rohan's report. Mr. Wojcik seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Board.

After discussion, Mr. Atkins made a motion to discontinue services from Spaeth Communications, with the exception of current work in progress. Mr. Haben seconded the motion, which was approved by the following vote:
