premiums and reduced the age at which Pensioners could receive DROP benefits without tax penalties.

Johnson chairs the Subcommittee that oversees pension law, the Subcommittee on Employer-Employee Relations and serves on the other committee with authority over this issue, the Ways and Means Committee.

After growing up in Dallas and graduating from Southern Methodist University, Johnson began his 29-year career in the U.S. Air Force, where he served as director of the Air Force Fighter Weapons School (Top Gun) and flew with the Air Force Thunderbirds precision flying demonstration team.

In the Korean War, Johnson flew

F-86s in 62 combat missions.

In the Vietnam War, Johnson flew F-4s. While flying his 25th combat mission in 1966, he was shot down over North Vietnam. He spent nearly seven years as a prisoner of war, half of that time in solitary confinement.

A decorated war hero, Johnson was awarded two Silver Stars, two Legions of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, one Bronze Star with Valor, two Purple Hearts, four Air Medals, and three Outstanding Unit Awards.

Sam Johnson is married to the former Shirley L. Melton, of Dallas. They are proud parents of three children, ten grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren.

I was proud to participate in a ceremony at our October Board meeting where Chairman Jerry Brown presented a plaque to Congressman Sam Johnson in appreciation for his efforts on the recently passed pension bill. Congressman Johnson was instrumental in assuring that two items of real importance to police officers and firefight-

ers were included in the bill. (See page 1 of this issue of the *First Responder*.)

Public Safety Officers have been working for a long time to get relief from the 10% penalty on DROP distributions taken by Members who left Active Service before age 55 and for help for Retirees with soaring health insurance costs.

We appreciate that Congress recognized that the career of First Responders by its nature, is shorter than that of most Americans and they therefore should not be subject to the same early distribution rules faced by civilian employees. We also like that Congress thought that Pensioners should have a similar kind of tax exclusion for health insurance premiums that active employees have.

We understand that costs associated with the two items we sought put these provisions at risk for the bill. Representative Johnson made sure our issues didn't get lost in the shuffle in the final resolution of the pension bill and were included in the final version passed by Congress and signed by the President.

Congressman Johnson once again showed that he is a friend to police officers and firefighters.
