Landmark Center, located in downtown Dallas.

Originally, 131,000 the square-foot, six-story building, at 1810 N. Lamar St. was owned for more than 50 years by General Electric Co., which used it as a warehouse and distribution center. In the late 1970's, the building was bought and converted into an office building, which was leased by the government for the FBI's Dallas regional headquarters.

In 2004, the Pension System

purchased and renovated the building into an urban loftstyle office design. Upon completion of the improvements, the building was leased up ahead of schedule, achieving 98% occupancy. The property was immediately marketed for sale, returning in excess of 25% to the System. We are pleased to have successfully and profitably engaged in the renovation of a downtown Dallas "Landmark."
