According to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, 181 officers gave their lives in 2007. That is 30 more than in 2006. This bears out the unfortunate trend we have been hear-

ing about throughout the last year or so. Accidents and assaults on police officers are on the upswing and sadly, more officers died in Texas in 2007 than in any other state.

If you've never taken the time to participate in the Police Officer Memorial Ceremony, I would urge you to do so. If you can't participate, then at least try to be in attendance. It is a chance to pay our collective respect to those who gave all there was to give and to pay a deep and solemn honor to the nation's officers who have earned it.

DPFP Website Provides Pension Information

One of the Pension System's best communications tools is our Web site at www.dpfp.org.

The agendas of all Board Meetings are posted at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

If there is breaking news with the Pension System, or an important reminder, it will be on the home page of the Web site.

You are able to download various publications of the Pension System, including the Member Handbook, the Plan Document, Annual Reports, and Newsletters.

Most of the Pension System forms are on the site. When getting ready to retire, you can print the forms and have most of them filled out before you get to your counseling appointment.

The newest and most popular feature of the Web site is Web Member Services, which allows members to sign in and view their pension information in a secure, on-line environment. Since launching Web Member Services in July of last year, over 2,100 members have established on-line accounts. The service has been designed to assist you in the planning and management of your retirement benefits. It offers access to some interactive services that can help you become more involved and better informed about your Pension benefits.

Active Members can access the following information:

- Account Summary (contributions and pension service)
- Demographic Information (address, phone number, etc.)
- Benefit Estimator (to calculate benefit estimates using System data)

Benefit recipients can also view the following information:

- Federal Tax Withholding
- Deductions

- Direct Deposit information
- Federal Tax Reporting Documents


In addition, participants in Active and Retiree DROP can access DROP account balances, and project future account balances.

First time users click on a link that will guide them through the process of setting up a user name and password to access their information.

There is an on-line "help" function with "easy-to-understand" menus which give outlined steps for accomplishing each task.

Security of your personal information is of prime importance to us. Our use of state-of-the art encryption technology ensures your privacy as you access and navigate this site.
